UPDATING YOUR CES INFORMATION A REMINDER TO ALL MEMBERS

Now that winter is well and truly here it is time to update your information on the CES website. It is important that we keep our information up to date for everyone's benefit.

To do this follow these steps:

Log on to the CES website – www.ces.org.za

Enter your Account Number and Password

Click on the "MY RECORD" tab at the top of the page.

It will then display your personal information, which you can update and save. (Save by clicking on the "UPDATE RECORD" button located on the green strip in the middle of the page).

Click on the "MY LOCAL OFFERINGS" button – This will bring up information on all the goods and services you currently have on offer.

Update these as required by editing, deleting, or updating the offer to today's date.

New offerings can be added by clicking on the ADD NEW OFFERINGS button near the top of the page.

EXPERT ANALYSIS...*Extract from an interview with*

Bernard Lietaer. Bernard is an Author and Expert on Complementary Currencies. The interview was made by Ravi Dykema in August 2003.

BL: Currently, our biggest problem with money and currencies is unconsciousness. We are not aware of what we are doing around money. We haven't really thought about what money does to us—we believe it's neutral, so it doesn't matter. But it's not neutral: it deeply shapes us and our societies. The first thing that has to happen before complementary currency systems can effect real change on a larger scale is a shift in consciousness and awareness.

RD: You mean, we need to be aware of how money works?

BL: Let me ask you this. Have you taken an inventory of the number of days you spend in life getting ready to make money? And when you have money, to manage the money or spend it? But then, think about how many hours you've thought about what money is. I suspect not very much. We are spending a huge amount of energy to get something about which we have surprisingly little understanding.

RD: Well, it's like the rain. It's something you adapt to.

BL: Yes, except that rain is not man-made. That's precisely the difference. We're treating money as if it is God-given, like rain or the number of planets in the solar system. But it isn't. If you don't like the quality of rain, there's not much you can do about it. If you don't like your money system, maybe you can do something about it.



TRADING TOOLS FOR TOUGH TIMES

An introduction to complementary currencies

Wednesday June 17, St Mark's Hall, Richmond Rd, Carterton

Programme

- 10.00am Registration, networking time and morning tea
10.30am Overview of programme and presenters. Introduction to Complementary Currencies what they are and how they work. Attendee introductions.
- 12 noon Lunch provided, networking time, trading tables, Complementary Currency resource material available**
- 1.00pm TimeBanking: Lyttelton has piloted NZ's first TimeBank and it is thriving. Time Banks are about members swapping their skills with one another and this is measured in time. Every person's time is regarded as equal. Margaret Jefferies and Anneleise Hall will explain what a Time Bank is, how it works and give an inkling of the huge potential that opens up when people share their skills within their community.
- 2.00pm Peter Luiten will present via powerpoint a new model for a community currency which enables people to purchase local goods and services with debit cards as well as paper means demonstrating how regular suppliers can create an interest-free means of exchange by spending as much new currency into their community as they are able to accept in payment over a normal business month. Its containment within a region is one of the currency's several "engines", re-energising local trading.
- 3.00pm Afternoon tea and networking time**
- 3.30pm Bryan Innes will present the Genuine Wealth system, adapted from a European interest-free loan model. Group savings are pooled into a holding account where the balance is used to allow interest free purchases for members of the group. Repayments include a portion of balance and an equivalent portion of compulsory savings until the purchase is fully paid off, allowing other purchases within the group. The pilot of this scheme, which will be presented, has enabled a family to build a house.
- 5pm Dinner provided, entertainment, networking time, books and resources available for purchase**
- 7-9pm Expert open panel discussion: Ask specific questions and gain deeper understanding from our specialist panel including Margaret Jefferies, Lyttelton – NZ's first Time Bank; Bryan Innes, Coromandel - Genuine Wealth System; Peter Luiten, Auckland - Links Trading System; Laurence Boomert, Wanganui - Smart Planet NZ; Hayden McGrail - Masterton, Wairarapa Local Exchange Trading System; Carolyn Hughes, Motueka - Living Economies Board.
