Greetings!

You will find enclosed with this newsletter a statement confirming our record of your transactions, a membership list of about 60 WAI\$PEOPLE, a skimlist that you could use to revise your directory listings or preferably to pass on to an interested friend and the latest (& greatest) directory.

For those who havn't traded yet (and there are a few too many of you) the directory is a comprehensive list of most of our skills, crafts, products, wants and needs. Using the membership number(s) beside each item look up the contact details on the list of WAI\$PEOPLE (some you may know already many you will enjoy meeting soon). Phone them up and discuss whether you can trade and then negotiate the price remembering that \$NZ dollars are equivalent to \$WAI\$.

Chitbooks have been made and are being distributed. These are now the preferred means of recording transactions. The trading details are entered onto the slip & butt rather like a chequebook with the slip sent on to us or "posted" into a drop-off box.

Ian Stewart, Eric McCutcheon and I ran a small workshop at the ACCENZ (Community & Continuing Education) conference held at Rathkeale on 31/08. Of the twenty participants one was involved in the Tauranga Exchange while most of the rest knew something about green dollars. Feedback at the conclusion indicated a great deal was learnt and that they would be getting involved in their local exchange and be encouraging others as well. Although we don't benefit directly from this type of exercise (and what a shame we couldn't take-up the accommodation offer in Tonga) we do help to strengthen the national movement and promote some personal growth both for the participants and ourselves.

Our office is now well established upstairs at "Purnell", thanks to Wairarapa Polytech who are also organising the manufacture of 5 drop-off boxes. These will be sited throughout the region at convenient locations where WAI\$ notices can be "posted". The boxes will cleared regularly. We plan to obtain our own phone number that can be switched to different phones and used at our office in the meantime...


